Words of Wisdom

In Matthew 18:21, the Apostle Peter asks Jesus an important question "Lord, how oft shall my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? Till
seven times?" Maybe Peter thought that he had a good number there, but
Jesus said "until seventy times seven." That number adds up to 490, but
was Jesus saying that Peter, and we, should keep track of the number of
times we forgive someone for the wrong they have done to us?
No, Jesus was teaching that we should always be ready to forgive others,
and he went on to tell a parable, which is a story with a good and deeper
meaning, about forgiveness. He told of a king who had a servant who
owed him a lot of money, but the king forgave him his debt. Then that
servant met another servant who only owed him a little bit of money, but
the first servant didn't forgive the servant who owed him. After the king
found out what the first servant had done, he punished that servant. The
first servant was forgiven a lot, but he didn't forgive someone else even a
little bit.

We as human beings have sinned against God, and when we ask God for forgiveness, He forgives us because Jesus died on the cross to pay the price for our sin. And so, just as God has forgiven us, we need to forgive others as well. Even in the Lord's prayer we pray, "forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." And then Jesus said in Matthew 6:15, "But if ye forgive not men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses." So we see how important it is to forgive others when they sin against us.

Notice to John Davidson Parents Regarding Appropriate Gym Shoes

As we excitedly prepare to move into our new school centre, the Physical Education team will be introducing rules and guidelines to protect the safety of students and the maintenance of our new gym.

As of **FEBRUARY 26th**, **2025** students will be required to wear appropriate athletic gym shoes in order to participate in P.E. Students will **NOT** be permitted to participate in these activities if they are wearing:

1. Dress-style shoes/ boots with a hard bottom.

2. No shoes and/or socks at all.

3. Cowboy Boots Or Sandals





Will not be allowed



Students will have the **option** to change into athletic **clothing** before and after gym class if they wish, but **the choice to do so is up to the student and parents.**

Appropriate athletic **shoes** are a matter of safety and care, and are **not optional**. **These shoes should have a WHITE BOTTOM to avoid spending class time removing scuffs**. Examples include:
